UM Brain exhibit fascinates at Job Corps

Students at Anaconda Job Corps Civilian Conservation Center recently got an up-and-close look at the most essential and fascinating organ: the brain. "Brain: The World Inside Your Head" is a traveling exhibit of the Montana Science spectrUM Experience that gives students around Montana a hands-on opportunity to learn more about neuroscience, the study of the brain.

The exhibit, which visited Anaconda Job Corps on Monday, included dissecting a sheep's brain, an exhibit on how scientists study the brain, and what grabbed the most attention from students were electronic games that measure the brain waves produced by concentration.

"It's awesome to get a chance to see hands-on science," said Sandra Walund, science and health teacher at Anaconda Job Corps, whose students aren't normally able to have a lab as part of their science instruction. "It's something different they don't get to do very often, and that's what we're all about - giving people a chance to get hands-on learning and get excited about science," added Lily Haines, one of two presenters of the exhibit from UM.

It was the second year in a row for spectrUM to visit Anaconda Job Corps: last year, students got to experience a "Hands on Health" exhibit that focused on the health of different parts of the body.
